A practical introduction to professional skincare that prepares learners to conduct a basic consultation, recognise common skin concerns, recommend an appropriate homecare routine and perform a structured introductory facial safely.

By the end of the course, learners should be able to

- Explain basic skin structure and barrier function.
- Distinguish skin type from skin condition.
- Conduct a basic client consultation and recognise common contraindications.
- Identify common concerns such as dehydration, sensitivity, acne, pigmentation, dullness and premature ageing.
- Build a simple homecare routine and perform a structured foundation facial.
- Recognise when referral is more appropriate than treatment.

Course modules

Module 1 - Skin science fundamentals

- Skin structure and function.
- Skin barrier, hydration, sebum and renewal.
- Factors that influence skin health.

- Explain the professional meaning of “glass skin” and distinguish hydration from oiliness.
- Assess dullness, dehydration, texture, sensitivity and barrier compromise.
- Select and sequence products for hydration and glow while avoiding unnecessary irritation.
- Design an appropriate glass-skin facial protocol and homecare routine.
- Adapt the facial for sensitive or pigmentation-prone skin.

Course modules

Day 1 - Glass-skin theory

- Hydration, barrier health, texture and luminosity.
- Causes of dullness and over-treatment.
- Korean layering: cleansing, toners/essences, ampoules/serums, masks, barrier creams and SPF.

Frequently Asked Questions

BEFORE YOU APPLY

Do I have to be a qualified beauty therapist to attend?

Not for every course. The SkinLab Starter and Business programmes are designed to be accessible to beginners. Intermediate and advanced programmes may require prior skin/beauty training or equivalent experience; eligibility is confirmed before acceptance.

Are the courses accredited?

Some selected learning pathways may include external recognition or certification. iNALA will confirm the exact external body and certificate for a specific programme before you enrol. Do not assume every course carries the same accreditation.

Will the training institution providing online theory be named?

Candidate materials focus on the iNALA Academy pathway and the relevant accreditation/certification status. iNALA manages the selected online-learning component as part of its in-house programme delivery.

Does the course fee include a starter kit?

Not unless your quotation specifically says so. Course-only fees are listed in this guide; optional starter/professional kits are quoted separately.

Where do I complete online learning?

Online theory used in selected hybrid programmes is completed in-house at iNALA with Academy support, unless an alternative arrangement is confirmed in writing.

Who supervises the practical work?
